



AUS GUIDELINE

Additional team personnel - Non Competing Officials

2016

INTRODUCTION

Universities participating at Australian University Sport events will be subject to this guideline which outlines the minimum number of non competing officials that can be registered to support a university team, for any AUS event.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this guideline is to ensure teams are supported by relevant and appropriate team management and personnel. AUS supports the attendance of spectators and university supporters but they should not be registered unnecessarily. All additional team personnel are required to register as a non competing official via the AUS online registration portal. Each person will incur a non competing official registration fee (charged upon registration).

This guideline will be implemented for the following AUS events:

- Australian University Games
- Australian University Championships (when held as a stand alone event)
- Regional University Games
- Regional University Championships (when held as an event conducted by AUS)

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* *University senior manager includes a staff member holding a senior manager role with sport or student services (or equivalent) departments. Must have at least four years experience with AUG events. Senior managers are required to register as University Team Managers.*

AUS may grant permission to register additional personnel. Requests should be made in writing to the [AUS registrations](#). All additional team personnel must be approved by the University Team Manager and be selected by university approved recruiting and selection processes.
